

DFW Connector TEXpress Lanes

OVERVIEW

TEXpress Lanes are unique toll lanes that are built within an existing highway. They add additional capacity to the highway to accommodate more traffic. Unlike other toll roads, the price changes based on the level of traffic in the corridor to maintain a minimum 50 mph speed of travel.

These TEXpress lanes are new to the Dallas-Fort Worth area and are unlike other toll roads in North Texas. It is your choice to drive in the TEXpress lanes and pay the tolls or to drive in the adjacent non-tolled general highway lanes. Go to www.texpresslanes.com for more information.

PROJECT DETAILS

- **Opening:** April 1, 2014 at zero cost; tolls begin July 7, 2014
- **Description:** Two lanes in each direction on SH 114
- **Length:** Approximately 4 miles
- **Entrances/Exits:** West of SH 26/East of Int'l. Parkway (DFW Airport)
- **Cost:** Dynamic pricing began Jan. 3, 2015
